There are physical signs characteristic of Down's syndrome, often Down's syndrome is also called "mongolism". It is easy to recognize students with Down's syndrome according to their characteristic physical signs:

- flat face profile;
- deformed ears;
- short wide hands;

short neck

- small head;
- Low muscle tone.

They also distinguish the features of intellectual development characteristic of Down's syndrome:

- As a rule, children with Down's syndrome are characterized by different degrees of intellectual development disorders. Most researchers note that the maximum level of intelligence development of children with Down's syndrome remains at the age of 6-8 years for healthy children. However, it should be noted that children with Down's syndrome differ from each other in their intellectual abilities and, as a rule, depending on their abilities, they achieve good results in studies.
- Another characteristic feature of children with Down's syndrome is attention problems lack of concentration, distraction. Children with Down's syndrome are characterized by easy switching, that is, any insignificant event or stimulus can make them stop their activity and completely switch to another insignificant activity.
- One of the most important problems of children with Down's syndrome is speech development. Very often, Down's syndrome is accompanied by various degrees of hearing disorders and, therefore, speech development and articulation problems.
- Children with Down's syndrome are quite stubborn and therefore they are characterized by periodic behavioral disorders. It is also very common for children with Down syndrome to have low self-esteem, which is caused by their physical data and significantly hinders children's normal functioning and learning motivation. Taking into account the abovementioned intellectual characteristics of a child with Down syndrome, certain teaching strategies are proposed that best respond to the educational needs of students with Down syndrome. Before going directly to the description of these strategies, we would like to mention that inclusive education is recognized as the best form of education for children with Down syndrome in the world today. Research has shown that a child with Down syndrome learns best when surrounded by typically developing peers and feels like a full member of the class. This increases his self-esteem, gives him a sense of belonging, teaches him the norms of social behavior, the desire to communicate contributes to the development of his speech, and as a result, optimal conditions for his development and education are created.

Teaching strategies for a child with Down syndrome

It has been proven that in the diagnosis of Down syndrome, early intervention and rehabilitation provide very good results both intellectually and emotionally.

- Use a multi-modal approach. Teach the child through touch, hearing and sight. For example, use existing books that have different sensory elements, make sounds and are characterized by textiles with different textures.
- Use as many concrete examples and real-life situations as possible for teaching. Talk to the child in a language he understands. If necessary, slow down the pace of your speech.
- Always divide tasks into small steps and provide the child with new instructions before each step. Remember, children with Down syndrome usually have very good short-term memory.

• In order to increase the concentration of attention, during the lesson, repeat the instructions to the student often. Breaking down the material and frequent instructions will make it easier for him to focus on the task and absorb the material.
